Primarily to show that the Cape's vinous heritage is worth celebrating and protecting, and that old vineyards and "ordinary grapes" provided are a wonderful opportunity of portraying what is possible. The Cartology cuvée is composed of rare and extraordinary parcels of mature dryland bushvines. The varieties used are - Chenin blanc and Semillon, and have been planted in the Cape for centuries. The Chenin comes from Skurfberg, Perdeberg, Bottelary, False Bay and Botrivier. The Semillon comes from the old La Colline block in Franschhoek. 2015 was an extremely good vintage for white wine in the Cape. Intensely flavoured; ripe pear, honey and limey citrus come to mind. There are herbal/floral notes too - spearmint and lime leaf. The natural acid is a treat.</i>	50.00

Everything here is hand-picked, carefully destemmed and then fermented at cool temperatures to get the purest expression of Godello from his prime fruit. Spends time on the lees in tank to intensify the flavour and add texture – simple yet intelligent, careful winemaking. Vegan Wine</i>	
303.	2016 Ribeiro Blanco 'V' Finca Viña - RIBEIRO, SPAIN	28.50
	<i>The Galician region of Ribeiro is not as well known in the UK as neighbouring Rías Baixas, but its dashing mineral whites are equally good at matching the abundant local seafood. Made principally from treixadura coming from a blend of grapes indigenous to Ribeiro, it is long and creamy on the palate with captivating aromas. Pairs superbly with seafood.</i>	
321.	2016 Lias Albariño, Bodegas Martin Códax - RIAS BAIXAS, GALICIA, SPAIN	30.35
	<i>A modern and dynamic co-operative, situated in the Salnés Valley, to the north of Rías Baixas, in the north-western region of Galicia. It was founded in 1986 by 50 families and has since grown to over 550 members.</i>	
305.	2017 Extramundi, Bodegas Pazo Tizón - RIBEIRO, SPAIN	30.25
	<i>Another offering from the fashionable region of Galicia, Extramundi refers to the area's otherworldly nature. This absolute winner is a fascinating blend of Treixadura, Albariño, Godello and Loureira, with a beautiful saline mouthfeel mixed with some apricot and peachy fruit characters. It is a stylish and sophisticated wine to enjoy with food.</i>	
317.	2016 Res Forts Blanc, Cotes-du-Roussillon - COTE DU RHONE, FRANCE	30.00
	<i>A fresh balanced white from the Rhone. Expect rich tropical fruit and steely notes, perfect summer drinking with light fish and roasted white meats. Its a cracker!</i>	
319.	2017 Gran Autocton Blanc, Autòcton Cellar - CATALUNYA, SPAIN	31.50
	<i>Autòcton Cellar (autòcton means local, indigenous). Selection of the oldest vineyards of local varieties like Sumoll, Xarel lo, Xarel lo Vermell, Malvasia de Sitges, Subirat Parent, Macabeu... fermented in tank or big barrels or amphores. The old vine fruit is aged in older French oak to add a light toasty veneer and creaminess to the concentration of ripe stone fruit flavours yet with no loss of the fresh acidity that gives both wines an appealing dry, almost mineral, finish.</i>	
322.	2018 "Le G" de Château Guiraud - SAUTERNES, BORDEAUX	33.50
	<i>A brilliant dry white Bordeaux from Château Guiraud in Sauternes. On the palate the wine is crisp and immediate, with crunchy Granny Smith apples, lemongrass, a touch of spice and a creamy, palate coating intensity. So vibrant and scintillating, the wine is wonderfully tensile with a core of tightly wound freshness. Great complexity at this price.</i>	
320.	2016 Terre Alte, Livio Felluga - FRIULI-VENEZIA GIULIA, ITALY	66.00
	<i>Created in 1981, Terre Alte is a balanced blend of Friulano, Pinot Bianco and Sauvignon grapes, estate-grown at Rosazzo in the historic Terre Alte vineyard. Intense fruit and flower aromas and outstanding structure. This exudes elegance and mineral intensity, a very Burgundian style! A full bodied, structured and layered wine which has a refreshing minerality followed by a persistent, complex finish.</i>	
420.	2017 Condrieu, DOMAINE LAFOY – COTE ROTIE	65.00
	<i>The nose is refined, has a neat air of pear, mandarin, flowers – it's a good, precise opening. The palate starts softly, flavoured with pear, vanilla and banana.</i>	

CHARDONNAYS - Non BURGUNDY LIGHTER BODIED

405. 2016 Dog Point Vineyard - MARLBOROUGH, NZ 36.25
A lovely structured and elegant wine. The vineyard takes a 'low tech' approach which is key to the quality of this wine.
412. 2015 Solea, Roagna - LANGHE PIEDMONT, ITALY 79.50
75 to 80% Chardonnay, 20 to 25% Nebbiolo. We have listed a few of the Roagna Family's red wines - namely his stunning Barbaresco, which had many of our customers falling over themselves, so a great treat to come across the white. A belief in keeping things natural no herbicides, pesticides or fertilizers in the vineyards, and a cover crop of grass forces the vine roots deeper to search for nutrients.

MEDIUM TO FULLER BODIED

406. 2017 '3' Lions, Plantagenet - ALBANY, WEST AUSTRALIA 24.75
A delicate and pure fruited style of Chardonnay, bursting with stone fruit and lemon blossom aromas. Lively flavours of grapefruit and lemon meringue are balanced by a subtle richness, while nervy cool climate acidity brings great persistence and just a hint of minerality. Plantagenet the winery is now self-sufficient, with 126 hectares of vineyard in Great Southern. All their wines are now made from estate fruit, so it makes sense that they should introduce a new label, with a link to the name Plantagenet.
404. 2017 Wild Boy - SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA (Low Stock) 40.00
In 1989 and 1990 Au Bon Climat was on Robert Parker's short list of Best Wineries in the World, and in 1991 was selected by Oz Clark as one of fifty world-wide creators of Modern Classic Wines. The winery has cultivated an international reputation for its wines, and recognised worldwide for classically styled wines. Pale straw with a green hue. The nose has lemon, lime and sherbet notes, ripe apple fruit with a viscous, mouth coating texture but with a zesty, medium finish to leave the mouth clean. Oak notable but not overwhelming.
402. 2015 Frogs Leap Vineyard - NAPA VALLEY, CALIFORNIA 43.60
Fans of the recent vintages of Frog's Leap Chardonnay will not be disappointed with this effort: precise, crisp flavors, a mouthfeel without weight all with intriguing aromas of toasted hazelnuts, cream, and white peaches. This wine is simply delicious and so unlike typical "fruity, sweet, oaky" California Chardonnays. A wine perfectly suited for any dish for which you would otherwise consider a lovely Chablis or a delightful white from Macon. John Williams has a simple philosophy which is emulated throughout his wines, of keeping things as natural as possible, let nature do the talking, something I wholeheartedly support - no irrigation, no fertilizers, no pesticides - is not a recent phenomenon that John has recently jumped on but one he has been practicing since he first started making wines at Frog's Leap in 1981.
411. 2017 M3 Shaw and Smith - ADELAIDE HILLS, AUSTRALIA 49.00
Shows the characters of the cool summer and autumn in 2012, with primary fruit notes of nectarine and cumquat, and vivid fresh acidity that provides structure and focus.
416. 2014 The Fuder Chardonnay – Clayvin, MALBOROUGH, NEW ZEALAND 60.00
This is an intense and complex Chardonnay offering ripe peaches, honey and cashews with brioche nuance. It shares its terroir with both savoury and mineral flavour. On the palate it has a satiny texture which is complemented by a lively acid backbone, its finishing with lingering honey notes.

CHARDONNAYS - BURGUNDY

In our humble opinion, the finest white wine producing area/region in the world.

CHABLIS

50 years ago there were just 400ha of vineyards in Chablis, today there are 4,900ha. The generic and premier cru vineyards have doubled since 1970. Being further north than the rest of Burgundy, and on a different version of limestone - Kimmeridgian, and some Portlandian the wines are subtly but fundamentally different in style - fresh minerality and steeliness which makes them so good with seafood. Allow the wines time to settle and relax in the glass, and enjoy it as it develops in the glass.

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MACON/CHALONAIS

The Mâconnais is a most dynamic region. In the past Pouilly Fuissé, rich and ripe white wines, stood out from the crowd, but a new generation of growers are now producing some excellent Mâcon Villages. These wines used to be cheap and simple, rarely lasting more than a year or two after the vintage, but now one or two growers in each village are making proper, oak aged, complex and reasonably concentrated wines which will develop well in bottle.

The Côte Chalonnaise is south of the main Côte d'Or, the vineyards are interspersed with other forms of agriculture, with just the more favoured slopes being dedicated to vineyards. These wines are fuller and richer, more intensity of fruit but with that glorious burgundian overtone of substance and style.

CHARDONNAYS - BURGUNDY

More Affordable Burgundy - *delicious on the palate, more palatable on the pocket!*

The cost of Burgundy just goes in one direction, UP!

Making it less and less affordable for wine lovers, as world-wide demand for these wonderful wines carries on unabated. What we have tried to do on this page, in addition to having a fabulous selection of wines from the Macon/Chalonais regions, is introduce wines from the classic villages from top producers but listing their generic wines, where the grapes used are from vines deemed to be too young, or from vineyards next door to the village classified wines but perhaps on the lower slopes. Whatever the reason, the wines listed below are delicious on the palate, and more palatable on the pocket!

VILLAGE OF VOSNE-ROMANÉE

VILLAGE OF MONTRACHET

The original Etienne Sauzet (1903-75) put together a wine domaine of around 12 hectares and established the Sauzet name as one of the top two or three addresses in the village. The vineyards have been farmed organically since 2006 and after two years of experimentation all switched to biodynamic cultivation from 2010. The grapes are sorted to remove grey rot where necessary, then pressed without crushing and fermented in oak until racking into tank before the next harvest, for a further six months élevage on the fine lees. Very aromatic, with more white flowers than yellow fruit. The palate has a good balance of acidity and concentrated fruit flavours. A lovely wine, elegant and tasting far above its AOC.

CHARDONNAYS - BURGUNDY

CORTON

These wines are the furthest north in Burgundy apart from the village of Marsannay. More subtle and have greater minerality than their counterparts further south. Nuit St Georges lies in the south of the Côte de Nuits, whilst Corton-Charlemagne lies astride three villages at the northern end of the Côte de Beaune - Ladoix, Aloxe-Corton and Pernand Vergelesses. The hill of Corton faces due south, with an extended flank exposed to the east, another facing westwards. The white wines mostly come from the west and south-west, with a narrow band around the top of the hill. These are cracking wines showing the minerality one would expect.

MEURSAULT

Meursault is probably the most famous and popular of the great white appellations. Its wines are typically rich and savoury with nutty, honeyed hints and buttery, vanilla spice from the oak.

SAINT AUBIN

Not the most famous of the Côte d'Or villages, but Saint-Aubin is one of Burgundy's top-performing wine communes in terms of both volume and vineyard quality; nearly three-quarters of its sites have Premier Cru status. Though Saint-Aubin wines are rarely considered to be among the region's finest, they are known for offering excellent value for money and can provide a good introduction to Burgundy wines of both colours. The Hubert Lamy domaine is now run by Olivier Lamy, an auspicious and meticulous eye for detail and all things natural.

CHARDONNAYS - BURGUNDY MONTRACHET

When it comes to the world's greatest white wines, the border between Chassagne and Puligny is it! So what is the difference you may ask?

CHASSAGNE-MONTRACHET

Chassagne's style is perhaps between that of Puligny-Montrachet and Meursault: less fine than Puligny, less rich and intense than Meursault but contains both. Chassagne is minerally yet succulent, often floral with hints of hazelnuts. **Les Chenevottes** vineyard is at the base of the Montrachet hill - it is one of the larger climats in the region, covering 22 acres (9ha) - rounded and medium-bodied, with nutty, herbaceous characters and plenty of verve. In addition to this the vineyard is at the northern end of Chassagne, near the southern end of the Le Montrachet Grand Cru vineyard – this probably speaks for itself! Total contrast **Les Baudines** is one of Chassagne-Montrachet's most elevated Premier Cru sites. Located at the very southern end of the commune, on the border with Santenay. Elegant, lean, white wine with fresh, stony characters. **La Grande Montagne** is located – as the name suggests - on the steep hillside of the same name just west of Chassagne-Montrachet. The most southerly of the limestone hills which make up the Cote d'Or escarpment.

PULIGNY-MONTRACHET

Puligny produces wines that are more striking than any, portraying an elegance alongside a stylish, steely concentration. They are very different to Meursault: more refined and delicate, and less rich.

Champ Gain - on the upper slopes of Puligny-Montrachet. The elevation and soil in this vineyard are quite different to other parts of the commune, which sets the wines apart from other Puligny wines. Light and elegant, with vibrant minerality and floral, citrusy flavors. Champ Gain translates roughly as "regained field" and refers to the fact that the now-valuable vineyard site was once scrubland and forest – a section of the scrubby Mont-Rachet hillside that gives the village its name. **Les Folatières** is the largest premier cru vineyard in Puligny-Montrachet. Located on the same line of the slope as the Le Montrachet and Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru vineyards. Les Folatières are typically Puligny - focused and minerally, but with nutty, rich overtones of fruit. **Champ Canet** on the northern boundary with Meursault - makes rich, racy white wines with floral, honeyed characters and good minerality. While not as steep as some of the vineyards further south in Puligny, Champ Canet has a good vantage over the countryside to the east from this position, consequently a good exposure to the morning sunlight. This helps ripening and giving the grapes a chance to develop varietal complexity.

In a top 100 list of most-searched Pinots, only four wines were from beyond Burgundy, and the highest-placed one of those was from Champagne (Krug Clos d'Ambois blanc de noirs). The red Burgundy grape does of course travel and is now made wherever winemakers fancy a challenge - because it is a notoriously difficult grape. Even within Burgundy there are noticeable differences between Pinots made in often quite nearby appellations, focusing right down to the vineyard level. It is a sure sign that a region is getting cocky when it starts trumpeting the quality of its Pinot – competing with some of the most treasured wines on earth takes a fair amount of!, but there is no shortage of places willing to have a go. Grown in a wide variety of places, a few regions – Oregon, parts of California and New Zealand, particularly are making heads turn.

The cost of Burgundy just goes in one direction, UP!

Making it less and less affordable for wine lovers, as world-wide demand for these wonderful wines carries on unabated. What we have tried to do on this page, in addition to having a fabulous selection of wines from the Macon/Chalonais regions, is introduce wines from the classic villages from top producers but listing their generic wines, where the grapes used are from vines deemed to be too young, or from vineyards next door to the village classified wines but perhaps on the lower slopes. Whatever the reason, the wines listed below are delicious on the palate, and more palatable on the pocket!

VILLAGE OF MOREY-ST-DENIS

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There is a long history of viticulture in the Taupenot family and Romain Taupenot, who runs this fantastic estate, is the seventh generation to make it his metier. In terms of vineyard holdings, thanks in large part to the history and depth of the family, the domaine is spread quite widely across the Cote d'Or with vines in Gevrey-Chambertin, Morey-St-Denis, Chambolle-Musigny, Nuits-St-Georges, Corton, Saint-Romain and Auxey-Duresses.

VILLAGE OF NUITS-ST-GEORGES

The domaine was founded in 1919 by Henri Gouges and continues to be owned and operated by the family, which dates its history back several generations earlier than their estate. In October it became immediately obvious that this Domaine is not sitting back on its laurels with the development of the most sophisticated winery you could ever imagine - all gravity fed to minimalise the usage of electric pumps – as natural as possible, following bio-dynamic principals are evident throughout the production process from beginning to end.

PINOT NOIRS - BURGUNDY

Unlike Bordeaux, Burgundy has a continental climate, and grows just one red grape variety – Pinot Noir; There are no myriad of Chateaux with their own vineyards, but here in this roll-call of evocative sounding names, are blocks or strips of vines tended by a multiplicity of owners, some grand but mostly modest. It is not enough to know the village and vineyard names, more important to Burgundy, is the name and reputation of the producer.

COTE DE NUITS TRAVELLING FROM THE NORTH TO SOUTH

In general, are weightier, firmer and more deeply-coloured than Côte de Beaune. The vineyards of Côte de Nuits are spread throughout 8 villages, from Dijon to Corgoloin, with 3000 hectares under production. The red wines represent 92% of production and are made up of Pinot Noir. The white wines, produced from Chardonnay, represent only 8% of production. Domains included from the Côte de Nuit – Romanée Conti, Comte Georges Vogue, Anne Gros, Mugneret-Gibourg, Armand Rousseau, Georges Noellat, Arnoux-Lachaux, Cyprien Arlaud. Visiting these esteemed houses is a very humbling experience as it brings you very close to the true magic of the terroir – something money cannot buy.

To try the 2015 and 2016 vintages from cask respectively, Domaines visited from the Côte de Beaune included Nicholas Rossignol, Benjamin Leroux, Olivier Lamy, Thomas Bouley, Aleth Girardin, Leflaive, Javillier and Sauzet. Add into the mix further south still but often overlooked areas which do however offer incredible value. Domaines of Bertrand Bachelet, Jean-Baptiste Ponsot and Charton, offer really first class approachable drinking burgundy. These are very exciting times in the Bourgogne with the rise of some exceptional young talent, and to witness the vitality and ingenuity of these wine makers shine through into the glass of wine is a real privilege.
